5. What are two (2) responsibilities that Waste Carriers have under Canada's waste regulation?

ANY 2 OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Keep copy of a certificate of approval in the truck at all times.
- Ensure MOE # is printed on the side of each truck
- Carry copies of your personal certificate of Reg. 347 training at all times (i.e. in truck)
- Ensure all compartments are properly sealed for transportation to prevent emissions and leakage.
- Ensure that any hazardous and non-regulated waste shipments are delivered to a Ministry approved site.
- Proof of liability insurance.



6. Provide two (2) examples of exempt wastes that would **not** be required to be accompanied by a waste manifest.

ANY 2 OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Agricultural Wastes
- Condemned animals
- Dead animals
- Inert fill
- Rock fill or mill tailings from a mine
- Municipal Waste
- Stockpiled or re-usable product
